

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

"And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love." 1 Corinthians 13: 13

February is a strange month. It may have 28 days or 29 days. And though it may continue to chill us with winter weather, we know that it is now just a few weeks (not months) before warmer weather springs forth (depending on what the groundhog says). And right in the middle of this month is the day we call "Valentine's Day," a day to celebrate love.

Love is the greatest of God's gifts. Faith and hope are great gifts, too. But they can be faked. People can claim to have them, but only to manipulate others. But love is different. Love is pure. True love cannot be faked.

I love what C. S. Lewis wrote: "Do not waste time bothering whether you love your neighbor; act as if you did. As soon as we do this, we find one of the great secrets. When you are behaving as if you loved someone you will presently come to love him."

God has loved us with a pure and generous and unconditional love. May we receive that gracious gift from God, and may we extend that gift to our neighbors as well. May we practice love in all our relationships and may we put our love in action.

Extra thoughts:

At our recent Annual Congregational Meeting, a motion was approved to extend a call to Pastor Josh Schunk. Should he accept the call, and all indications are that he will, he would begin serving as your new pastor in June. That means you are stuck with me through May.

Pastor Schunk has a unique style of leading worship. Over the years, I have learned that every pastor has his/her own style – though there are some who might say I have no style. But the important thing is the proclamation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

I trust that the Holy Spirit has been involved in this call process, and I look forward to seeing all the good that God has in store for this congregation with your new pastor.

A Pastoral Message from Bishop Hagmaier

Siblings in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of the Triune God!

I must write to you now with a heavy heart and profound sadness, but with a sure hope in Christ alone. I can no longer remain silent in the face of overwhelming presidential executive orders thrusting our nation into chaos and willfully widening the rift between people. While I could steward my fears leading up to the presidential election and inauguration, I am no longer willing.

My mentor bishop, Bishop Emeritus Jon Anderson, told me at my installation that I have one job: always to protect the Gospel. Therefore, here I stand now, and I can do no other. Lutherans, specifically ELCA Lutherans, understand the Gospel as the good news of God's unconditional love and saving grace revealed through Jesus Christ's life, death, and resurrection. This news frees us to live in faith, love, and service to others. Therefore, to vilify immigrants but validate insurrectionists, reject climate care but rejoice in fossil fuels, seek retribution for political opponents and not help the poor and oppressed is in direct opposition to who we are as baptized children of God and as members of the body of Christ.

I ask you not to hear me as arrogant or haughty; I speak sincerely as a fellow sinner who needs mercy. Nevertheless, I have deep concerns for our nation's soul and people of faith. Admittedly, these concerns arise from my story, deeply rooted in my German heritage. I am a child of World War II survivors growing up in West Germany during the Cold War era, a time when the German Church wrestled with the fact that because of devout Christians who were confused about the Savior, 70-85 million lost their lives in one of the largest genocides in history. Making sense of such a heinous and atrocious crime still haunts the German nation to this day.

Growing up in such an environment set the table for the Reformer Martin Luther, pastor-theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer, and scholar Karl Barth to sit with me at home, school, and church. These three men are steady companions on my journey. And when they drop by, I am always a bit nervous around them, rightly so, since they have some gravitas to them. They talk about worldly powers, the church, and faith from challenging experiences. Simultaneously, they speak with loving conviction. I often sat listening to them, wondering if I ever had to be like them someday. And the answer always remained the same; "You'll find out, and you'll know when your time has come."

As I lead the Synod through these times, I will adhere to my call to protect the Gospel with my life, words, and deeds, and I invite you to do the same.




support of your youth each year! This fundraiser helps with the cost of camp, Sr. High trips, and other activities throughout the year like the corn maze. Thank you!

Active Generations will deliver the meals to the Splitrock Apartments at 1100 Teakwood Street Bandon, SD around 11:30 am. Red and Blue meal bags are dropped off inside the entry of the Apartment Building. Meals are delivered in the apartment complex first followed by the rest of the city.

Depending upon the number of clients receiving meals, it takes approximately 1 hour for delivery. The client list and addresses are clear and accurate.

I will be absent for February and part of March. This time away will allow us to create more concrete plans.




